We work collaboratively. The pandemic has given us the tools to work and network across the world, just as we're doing here. Our friends are too many to show here, but we extend our gratitude to each one. Together, we are strong.

We held our own R&B Synod in 2020 - 2021, culminating in Bristol in Sept 21. At this seminal meeting we finalised our Bristol Text.

Before Pope Francis announced his worldwide Synod, we had determined on our Journey of Discernment towards a Synod which began with women, and didn't end there. Professor Mary McAleese headlined for us, and was in company with more than 40 internationally acclaimed leaders, theologians, writers and activists. We were delighted to have Virginia, Kochurani, Eleanor and Tina with us in September 2021, during a year of thought and debate, culminating live and online at Bristol. You can find our resulting Bristol Text to Reform, and every single talk, all on our website.

Not a conclusion, but a beginning. R&B DIY.

How do R&B experience sacramental life?

Our concept as Catholics has become frozen in some ways, and static. What reality do those sacraments really hold for those young people? How many remain in the Church? In Root & Branch, we have begun - as have so many communities across the world - to live out and to be, the Church we want to see. Together, in small groups. We call it, R&B, DIY. Do It Yourself.

Colm Holmes, of We Are Church Ireland, so wisely advises, use the 80 / 20 rule. Use 20% of our energy trying to change our Church, and 80% of our energy being that Church.

But we also find ourselves drawn to work for issues widely ignored by most of our parishes and churches. After many months of quiet collaboration with Scottish Laity Network, and in deep gratitude to our wise advisor survivors, we felt honoured to draw together our Stolen Lives series earlier this year.

In Koekelburg, in Flanders, in a quiet chapel of the Basilica, this infant's white dress holds witness to the suffering of little ones, and all who have been vulnerable to abuse. Amongst the experts who joined us to tell the stories that must be told, and to ask, What Can We Do, Francis Sullivan joined us from Australia, Tom Doyle from the USA, and ex-priest Brian Devlin with journalist Catherine Deveney from Scotland. From this we produced our Stolen Lives Learning Resource, freely available on our website.

The wounds to our Church are so deep, and so hidden, that we cannot truly move forward until they are healed. Our survivors are key to our Church's health.

We also have a Synod Watch section on our website dedicated to parish and Diocesan submissions - we are currently mapping the latter against our Bristol Text. So many parishes are asking for the simple reforms to ministry, diversity, moral theology, and authority in the Church which our Text spells out so clearly. And - we can also see where what the people ask for does <u>not</u> make the Diocesan Summary!
